Report:

Background:

As per the Municipality of Brockton's Purchasing and Procurement Policy requirement to report purchasing results over \$25,000.00 to Council for information purposes.

The Recreation department issued formal Request for Quotation (RFQ) #REC2021-03 – Walkerton Community Centre Central Hot Water Boiler Replacement.

A formal RFQ was issued and forwarded to six qualified area vendors by invite only on Tuesday June 22, 2021 and closed on Wednesday July 7th, 2021 2:00 p.m. Two (2) quote bids were received from local or regional companies that ranged from \$40,753 to \$111,566. All quotations met the requirements of the RFQ specifications. The recommended quote was reviewed and approved by the CFO. The lowest quotation of \$40,753.16 + HST inclusive of full installation was accepted from Montgomery Industrial (Emke Schaab).

Analysis:

The formal RFQ provided competitive results from reputable vendors. Installation is anticipated to be completed on or before August 20th to ensure the ice plant is up and running for the ice season and ensure we are able to resume "normal" operations.
