Report:

Background:

The 2022 Annual Billing Statements have been released, along with a detailed breakdown of costs and calls for service.

Analysis:

On September 30, 2021, the Municipality received the 2022 OPP Annual Billing Statement. This year's billing package includes the statement for the 2020 year-end reconciliation. 2019 was the last year the municipal policing costs were subject to capped increases or decreased based on the year-over-year variance in the per property costs. At this time there is no information on the Court Security Prisoner Transportation Grant (CSPTG) Allocation, staff will provide Council with an update once the information is received.

The total annual cost for policing has decreased by \$143,441/year from \$2,630,375 to \$2,486,934.
