Recommendation:

That the Council of the Municipality of Brockton hereby approves Report Number BLDG2018-04 – Building Permit Refund, prepared by Terry Tuck, Chief Building Official and in so doing accepts the recommendation to not waive building permit fees.

Report:

Background:

We have received a letter from the Cargill and District Community Fund (CDCF) requesting Council waive the building permit fee in the amount of \$7,100.00.

As a reminder a report concerning waiving permit fees was presented to Brockton Council in November 2004 from the CBO. Council agreed with the CBO's recommendation, and decided to donate monies equal to the permit fee back to volunteer organizations. I have to assume that the permit fee for the 2007 addition to the Cargill Community Centre was returned to the committee as a donation and that the fee stayed in building department's budget.

At the February 12, 2018 Council Meeting, Brockton Council approved Resolution 18-04-044 that approved funding Option 2 for the proposed Cargill and District Community Centre renovation project, partnering with the CDCF with 60% of the total project to be funded by CDCF through fundraising, grants, and financing option. With the remaining 40% to be funded by the Municipality.

Analysis:

The Building Code Act states that a permit **shall not be considered issued** unless the permit fee is paid. All departments are expected to balance their respective budgets. The building department cannot balance its budget if council waives permit fees.

We do not recommend Council consider refunding the building permit fees. The Municipality has supported this project and the fees should be included as part of the project costs which will in turn be covered 40% by the Municipality as part of the total project costs.
