That the Council of the Municipality of Brockton hereby receives Report Number REC2018-16 – Reciprocal Agreement for Bluewater District School Board, prepared by Eric McDougall, Parks, Recreation and Facilities Supervisor and in doing so approves proceeding to enter into a reciprocal agreement with the Bluewater District School Board; and further approves a By-Law coming forward to authorize signing.

Report:

Background:

Brockton Parks and Recreation has an ongoing working relationship with the Bluewater District School Board where each party extends the use of resources, such as facility space to the other with the understanding that this exchange benefits both parties. Brockton Parks and Recreation and Bluewater District School Board have had a reciprocal agreement in place since 2012 and renew on each new term of council.

Analysis:

The reciprocal agreement maximizes the use of public infrastructure; reducing facility operating costs; strengthening relationships between school boards and community partners and the public. This agreement improves the level of service and support that recreation can offer to the community and alternatively provides more opportunities and support to the students. Currently we utilize Walkerton District Community School (WDCS) with our cooking classes at the school kitchen, Drop in Dodge ball in the gymnasium, and our Walking Program in there halls. All of these programs are well attended and would not be possible without the use of their facility.
