Calls for Service of Note

Property Crimes

Robbery – The robbery consisted of the theft of a cell phone as a result of a fight.

Theft – A significant number of the thefts involved the theft of fuel.

Mischief – A number of the mischief calls for service involved damage to motor vehicles and in some cases appeared to be targeted. Charges were laid in one of these instances.

Arson – On December 1st, 1st Responders were dispatched to a fire at an apartment complex on John Street in Walkerton. The quick response resulted in the building being safely evacuated and no serious injuries were reported. Officers were able to transport the residents to the Community Centre until they able to be alternatively housed. After an investigation into the fire, a male resident of the building was charged with Arson – Disregard for Human Life.

Drug Crimes

Warrant – On October 20th, a search warrant was conducted on Amelia Street in Walkerton by the Community Street Crimes Unit. Almost \$200,000.00 worth of drugs was seized from this location as well as a number of replica weapons and a loaded handgun. Five individuals were arrested and charged.

Warrant – On November 3rd, a search warrant was conducted by the Community Street Crimes Unit in Ripley resulting in the seizure of Methamphetamine and Cocaine worth over \$120,000.00. Also recovered was a stolen vehicle. Four individuals were charged due to this warrant.

Warrant – On November 15th, a search warrant was conducted in Arran-Elderslie by the Community Street Crimes Unit. This warrant took place after months of investigation and significant community concern. A large quantity of Methamphetamine was seized and a large amount of stolen property recovered. Three people remain in custody as a result of this warrant. This will have significant community impact throughout the South Bruce Detachment area. Some of the items recovered are listed here:

- Ford F150 pick-up truck
- Dodge Ram pick-up truck
- Dodge Charger
- Ski-Doo GSX snowmobile
- 2 Polaris snowmobiles
- Honda TRX All-Terrain Vehicle (ATV)

- Triton snowmobile trailer
- Stihl concrete saw
- Rolair air compressor
- 9 Rifles, 2 Shotguns, a Crossbow with night vision scope, 2 antique pistols, 2 pellet rifles and a large quantity of ammunition.

Possession – Drug seized in all possession occurrences was Methamphetamine.

<u>Traffic</u>

Impaired Driving - A call from a member of the public resulted in a male driving a tractor being arrested for Impaired Driving.

Operation Impact – Operation Impact Traffic Initiative took place over the Thanksgiving weekend. Officers laid two Impaired Driving charges during the campaign.

Festive RIDE – On 01 Dec, South Bruce OPP joined with Grey Bruce OPP and the Grey Bruce Municipal Police Services to launch the 2023 Festive RIDE campaign. A large joint RIDE was held just south of Owen Sound. During the Festive R.I.D.E. campaign, officers dedicated approximately 150 hours. 145 checkpoints were set up in all of our municipalities within the detachment area with the following results:

- 1 motorist was charged with a graduated license violation blood alcohol above zero
- 2 driver's license suspensions were issued for a warn result at the roadside resulting from a BAC above .05 mg of alcohol
- 4 motorists were charged with Impaired Driving and had their licence suspended automatically for 90 days and their vehicles impounded for 7 days

<u>Other</u>

By-law - Officers continued to work with Municipality of Brockton By-law and assisted by social service agencies to address the various encampments in the area.

Foot Patrol – 145 hours of Foot Patrol was dedicated over the three month period.

Crime Stoppers – 3 tips specific to Brockton were received from Crime Stoppers.

Training – Officers participated in the three-day multi-agency Emergency exercise hosted by Bruce Power called Huron Endeavour. This included participation of our Regional Emergency Operations Centre and a number of external resources such as our Emergency Response Team. Many best practices and lessons learned were taken away from this exercise placing South Bruce OPP in a good position to respond to a large-scale emergency and/or nuclear emergency. **MCRT** – On November 28th, South Bruce and Grey Bruce OPP partnered with Grey Bruce Health Services to launch a Mobile Crisis Response Team (MCRT). Julie ROBINSON, a Mental Health Nurse, is assigned to South Bruce OPP and has begun responding the Mental Health calls for service as a ride-along model with our officers. Julie will provide services including but not limited to de-escalation and short-term crisis intervention, safety planning and stabilization, referrals to appropriate services for long term support, and recovery-oriented interventions. Since it's inception, Julie has responded to 30 calls for service with our officers and completed 12 after the fact referrals. Thirteen individuals were diverted away from unnecessary Emergency Room visits and were provided appropriate resources. We also continue to benefit from our partnership with MMHART who also provide a co-response model with our officers.

Detachment Updates

A letter of thanks was received regarding PC GINGERICH's professionalism and compassion when dealing with the young driver of a Motor Vehicle collision.

Police Service Board Survey results

In June 2022, OPP Police Services Boards (PSBs) were surveyed to identify the metrics and information that would be most valuable to support goal setting and decision making, specific to community safety. Below are some highlights following analysis of the survey responses that can be shared with your PSBs:

- The survey was distributed to 117 OPP Police Services Boards.
 - 1. The response rate was 91% (only completed surveys were included for analysis).
- The following metrics, currently provided to PSBs, remain of value:
 - 1. Number of violent crime occurrences
 - 2. Number of property crime occurrences
 - 3. Number of Controlled Drugs and Substances Act (CDSA) occurrences
 - 4. Clearance rates for violent, property and drug occurrences
 - 5. Number of motor vehicle collisions, including persons killed and causal factors.
- PSBs are also interested in receiving the number of other criminal code occurrences (94%), provincial statutes (72%) and federal statutes occurrences (64%)
- Cruiser patrol (97% interest) and focused patrol (71% interest) were of greatest interest pertaining to patrol hours, followed by foot patrol hours (67%).
- The type of prevention initiatives (93% interest) and the number of initiatives completed (88% interest) were of high interest to the PSBs.
- The following non-crime-related occurrences were of most interest (listed in order of interest):
 - 1. Mental health-related occurrences 93%
 - 2. Traffic complaints 87%
 - 3. Opioid-related occurrences 82%
 - 4. Domestic disturbances 78%

- 5. Alarms/false alarms 64%
- 6. Missing persons/Noise complaints 60% respectively
- 7. Marine/waterway incidents
- Youth crime was of interest to 91% of respondents, specifically the types of crimes and number of crime-related occurrences.

- The number of criminal records checks performed for a municipality was of interest to 51% of respondents.
- The number of policing hours within a municipality was of interest to all (100%) PSBs.
- Good new stories (86% interest), detachment announcements (79% interest) and commendations (79%) were of interest to the PSBs.
- Public complaints (87%) and the number of substantiated versus unsubstantiated complaints (76%) were of most interest to PSBs.
- The *Calls for Service Billing Summary Report* is used by 60% of respondents for goal setting/decision making.
- Preferred time frames for reporting metrics were equally split between two and three years (36%) (current year + 1 or 2 previous years).
- Eighty-three percent (83%) of PSBs indicated that information reported at the detachment level would meet their needs.

The OPP is continuing to assess findings, conduct research and establish methodologies to support reporting on the adequate and effective delivery of policing services to PSBs. It is anticipated that enhanced reporting to PSBs will commence in late 2023.
