Calls for Service of Note

Property Crimes

Theft – Several of the theft calls for service were related to shop lifting from stores where video surveillance is being reviewed.

Mischief – Some of the mischief calls for service involved damage to motor vehicles.

Break and Enter – Each of the break and enters were related to small value items being stolen.

Traffic

Fatal Motor Vehicle Collision – On February 4th, 2023, the South Bruce OPP responded to and investigated a fatal motor vehicle collision involving a motorized snow vehicle in Brockton.

3 Day – Warn Range Suspension – While investigating the fatal motor vehicle collision involving a motorized snow vehicle, officers interacted with another snowmobiler who had consumed alcohol and was operating their snow vehicle. An Approved Screening Device was administered, and the driver registered a warn range on the device and his drivers license was subsequently suspended for 3 days.

RIDE – Significant efforts have been made to ensure visibility with proactive RIDE programs throughout this reporting period. 22 RIDE checks were completed in Brockton over these 2 months.

ICC / ALPR – In January, In Car Camera's (ICC) and Automated License Plate Recognition has been installed in frontline OPP police vehicles. In addition to the benefits that will come with having an objective video recording of an interaction between an officer and member of the public, the integrated ALPR functionality will dramatically enhance the ability of an officer to detect licence plates that are linked with criminal or traffic offences. Examples would include plates associated with wanted or missing people, stolen vehicles, stolen or unattached licence plates, suspended and prohibited drivers and with other emergent situations like Amber Alerts.

Other

Fill a Cruiser – On April 1st, 2023 members of the South Bruce OPP Auxiliary Unit conducted a 'Fill a Cruiser' event at the grocery stores in Walkerton. As a result, a large donation of food was donated to the local food bank.

Foot Patrol – 93 hours of Foot Patrol was dedicated over the two month period.

Focused Patrol – Cargill – A Focused Patrol was conducted in Cargill for just over a month during this reporting period. During that month, 11 hours were dedicated to this Focused Patrol, 1 charge was laid in relation to an unlicensed driver and 1 warning was issued for speeding.

Saugeen River Bridge in Walkerton – Detachment members met with key stakeholders to discuss the anticipated bridge closure over the Saugeen River in downtown Walkerton. Feedback was provided given the impact on the community and emergency services with this bridge closure.

Crime Stoppers – 2 Crime Stoppers tips were received over the two-month period.

Training – Officers participated in STAR (Grey Bruce Situation Table for Acute Risk) training at the Walkerton Clean Water Center on March 31st, 2023. This training was very well attended by key community stakeholders and will assist detachment members in coordinating services for those at acute risk.

Detachment Updates

Provincial Constable Chris Allred has transitioned into his new Detective Constable role within the Community Street Crime Unit at the detachment. DC Allred has a wealth of experience, and we look forward to his investigative expertise in his new position.

Provincial Constable Mike Wilken has accepted a Temporary Assignment as an Acting Sergeant in the Municipal Liaison Sergeant position in Kincardine. A/Sgt. Wilken has a great deal of experience, and we look forward to his leadership in his new role.

Sergeant Kendall Ward has announced his upcoming retirement date of April 25th, 2023. Sgt. Ward has significant ties to the South Bruce area and has dedicated most of his career in policing to the South Bruce area. We wish Kendall well in his retirement and his leadership in the detachment will be greatly missed.
