Recommendation:

That the Council of the Municipality of Brockton hereby receives Report Number REC2023-15 — Elmwood Playground Resurface, prepared by Trish Serratore, CFO/Acting Director of Community Service and Brad Thomson, Acting Community Services Supervisor, and in doing so approves proceeding with the playground resurfacing at the Elmwood playground.

And Further, approves the CFO to transfer \$16,263.84 from the Elmwood Community Reserve Fund to fund the project.

Report:

Background:

During the April monthly playground inspection staff noted that the Elmwood Community Centre playground required resurfacing to address safety concerns noted during the inspection.

To prevent injuries, it is required by CSA Z614:20 Children's Playground Equipment and Surfacing Standard to not have any bases of equipment showing through the surfacing. The surface material shall have a gmax not exceeding 200 and a HIC (head injury criterion) not exceeding 1,000 when tested, metal does not fit within these parameters set out by CSA.

Staff received quotes for resurfacing the playground and forwarded them onto the Elmwood Community Centre Board for a decision.

Analysis:

At the April 19th Elmwood Community Centre Board (ECCB) special meeting the ECCB approved resurfacing the Elmwood Community Centre playground for a total of \$20,536.29 from ABC Recreation. To fund this project

the board is requesting to access \$16,263.84 from the Elmwood Community Reserve Fund (Natalie Schultz Fund) and the remainder will be funded from the ECCB Donation fund which currently has \$10,659.46.

Staff are recommending Council approve this request, if left alone the playground surfacing will become more deteriorated and cause a greater safety concern for all users. With the current state of the playground surface, if we do not proceed with replacement, staff will have no other option but to close the playground as it does not meet the minimum standards.
