





Calls for Service of Note

Violent Crime:

Assaults - In comparing April of 2022 and April of 2023, there were 3 additional assaults reported for a total of 5. 3 of the 5 were assaults involving local youth. The other 2 were domestic in nature.

Sexual Assaults - There were 2 sexual assaults investigated during April of 2023. One of these sexual assaults was domestic in nature.

Property Crime:

Break and Enter – 3 break and enters were reported during the month of April. 1 of the break and enters was reported at a Municipal Landfill site. The e-waste container was entered and nothing was reported to be stolen. The other 2 break and enters were unoccupied residences.

Thefts – There was a significant reduction in thefts over this reporting period. 1 of the 2 thefts was resolved by charges and was minor in nature. The other theft was a stolen child's pedal car.

Traffic:

Impaired Driving – Officers apprehended 1 impaired driving in April of 2023. This impaired driver was found to have 3 times the legal limit of alcohol in his body and posed a significant public safety risk with his driving behaviour.

Traffic Enforcement / Education – Over the month of April, officers issued 56 Provincial Offence Notices for a variety of Provincial Offences. Further to this, they issued 86 formal warnings for a variety of Provincial Offences.

Spring Seatbelt Campaign – From April 7 – 10 officers were highly visible conducting the Spring Seatbelt Campaign. Officers charged 4 individuals for not properly wearing their seatbelt restraints.

Other:

Crime Stoppers – 1 tip specific to Brockton was received from Crime Stoppers

Foot Patrol – 49.75 hours of Foot Patrol were dedicated over the 1 month period.

Training – During April a member attended training related to Investigating Offences Against Children. Further to this, a member attended a 2 week marine course to receive further certification as a Launch Operator.

MCRT – MCRT supported detachment members and responded to 23 mental health related calls for service. Of these 23 calls for service, 22 of them were diverted away from an apprehension and the hospital. MCRT continues to be a vital component to our detachment and the program continues to demonstrate positive impacts on the community.

Media – PC Kevin Martin was busy during the month of April and released 2 public safety communications. These communications were to alert local drivers to be aware of some of the road safety concerns attached to seasonal change. He provided messaging to remind the public to share the roads with farm equipment and to be aware of the increase of deer related collisions.

Detachment Updates:

On April 1st officers conducted a food drive at local grocery stores in Brockton. It was extremely well-received and officers made a substantial donation to the local food bank. This food drive has been previously reported.

In April, Retired Auxiliary Staff Sergeant Dennis Dick was recognized for over 20 years of volunteerism as an O.P.P. Auxiliary member. Over the 20 years he has made significant contributions to our communities and organization in his role.
