Re: Request to waive Cargill Pavilion rental fee

After last year's success, the Saugeen Artists Guild is hosting our second Plein Air Festival July 19th to 23th, 2023. At the request of last year's participants we are attempting to create "meet-up" locations where artists are introduced to a site in the area and provided shelter from the sun or rain and access to washrooms.

We recently learned that Brockton will waive pavilion fees or provide tents to not-for-profit organizations hosting events in the community. One of the locations we are planning is in Cargill the afternoon of July 21st. We are asking that Brockton waive the \$40 fee for the event.

- o In the afternoon you're invited to visit the village of Cargill to paint the mill pond and visit the Cargill Gallery, café and ice cream wagon.
