That the Council of the Municipality of Brockton hereby receives Report Number REC2023-23 - Recreation Use of Bar Fee Amendment, prepared by Trish Serratore, Chief Financial Officer/Acting Director of Community Services and in doing so approves a By-Law coming forward to amend the Fees and Charges By-Law to amend the "Use of Bar – Ice, Mix, Cup" fee from \$200/event to cost recovery per event fee.

Report:

Background:

On November 1, 2022 Council approved the 2023 Brockton Fees and Charges which included a new recreation fee for the bar use set to \$200 per event.

Analysis:

Prior to the new 2023 Use of Bar fee, Brockton had a cost recovery model where the use of the bar was billed out after the rental. Staff recommended the set rate to reduce administration costs, however, staff have identified the new set fee is not cost recoverable. With the increase in the cost of supplies the municipality is operating at a net loss.

Staff recommend amending Schedule G - Use of Bar - Ice, Mix, Cups to be cost recoverable. Staff will return to billing after the event for the hall rental and cost of the ice, mix and cups used.
