





# **Calls for Service of Note**

#### Violent Crime:

Assaults – There were 6 assaults investigated in September – October of this year. 3 of the assaults involved Intimate Partner Violence, 1 was in a familial setting and the other 2 involved disputes among youth and acquaintances.

Abduction – There is 1 abduction reported during this reporting period. This statistic is as a result of an Intimate Partner Violence investigation where assault and forcible confinement charges were laid.

### **Property Crime:**

Break and Enter – During the 2 month reporting period, officers investigated 3 break and enters. These investigations were in relation to a break and enter to 2 vacant properties and 1 storage unit. These investigations remain on-going.

Theft Under – There was a significant reduction in theft under \$5000 when comparing it to previous years. There were a total of 7 occurrences which includes: thefts from a scrap yard, theft of lawn ornaments, thefts from storage units and a stolen bike. In the stolen bike investigation, a suspect was identified and has been arrested and charged.

Frauds – 4 Frauds were investigated over the 2 month period, this is down from 7 in the previous year. 3 of the 4 frauds were considered online frauds and victims lost a total of \$2000.

Community Street Crime Unit – On the October 6<sup>th</sup>, 2023, our CSCU executed a search warrant in relation to stolen property and drugs in the Town of Hanover with the assistance of the Hanover Police Service. In this search warrant officers recovered a stolen generator, a BB gun, ammunition, a trail camera and Stihl tools. The value of the stolen property is estimated to be \$1000. Officers also seized a quantity of Methamphetamine and Fentanyl. 4 individuals were charged and held accountable as a result of this investigation.

Repeat Offender Parole Enforcement – On September 27<sup>th</sup>, 2023, our ROPE Squad located and apprehended an individual in Walkerton that was unlawfully at large on a Canada Wide Warrant. The ROPE Squad was supported by the South Bruce Detachment as well as the Emergency Response Team who all worked together to safely apprehend this individual.

### Traffic:

On Friday September 14<sup>th</sup>, 2023 members of the South Bruce OPP Detachment conducted RIDE checks throughout the detachment area in targeted locations. Throughout the nightshift officers apprehended 3 impaired drivers, issued a warn range suspension to a novice driver for having a BAC above 0, and charged a driver for driving while under suspension.

During September and October officers participated in 2 traffic campaigns, Labour Day traffic campaign targeting the Big 4 causal factors in collisions which contribute to personal injury and death and the

Thanksgiving seatbelt campaign. Officers were dedicated over these busy weekends to ensure the motoring public was as safe as possible.

Foot Patrol – Officers conducted 64 hours of foot patrol in Brockton over the 2 months.

#### **Detachment Updates:**

September and October have been busy months with movement of personnel. D/Cst. Brad Larson has accepted a lateral transfer into another investigative role outside of the detachment. We wish Brad well in his new position and I am certain he will continue to have a positive impact on public safety. PC Ed Brunk accepted a lateral transfer to Huron County Detachment. Ed won't be going far, and I'm certain he will continue to excel in Huron.

On September 27<sup>th</sup> PC Tyler Beukema accepted a lateral transfer to the South Bruce Detachment from Wellington County Detachment. Tyler has joined 'A' platoon and is a welcomed addition to our team. PC Drew Bean has accepted a lateral transfer to the South Bruce Detachment from the Grey Bruce Detachment. Drew has joined 'D' platoon and we are very excited to have him join our team.

Acting Detective Sergeant Dave Greer competed for the vacant Detective Sergeant position in South Bruce. Dave was successful in this process and has accepted a promotion as our Area Crime Supervisor and is now a confirmed Detective Sergeant. Dave has a wealth of experience with criminal investigations and we're looking forward to continuing to work with him in this role now as our permanent Detective Sergeant.
