Background:

To provide quarterly statistics related to Animal Control and By-Law Enforcement activity for the period of August 1st 2023 to October 31st, 2023.

Analysis:

By-Law Enforcement Activity

The Municipality of Brockton received a total of 30 complaints from August 1st, 2023 to October 31st, 2023. Of the 30 complaints received during the reporting period, 27 are now inactive and will be monitored for continued compliance. Staff will continue to work towards voluntary compliance with the remaining 10 active files to achieve compliance.

The following chart provides an overview of by-law enforcement activity related to formal complaint matters within the Municipality of Brockton. These numbers do not reflect the ongoing by-law matters or files that have been re-opened due to reoccurring violations of a municipal by-law.
