


### **Background:**


To provide an annual statistics report on Building Department Activity for Council's information purposes.


#### **Analysis**:


A total of 166 Building Permits were issued in 2023 with a total Estimated Value of Construction of \$64,113,838.90. Residential Construction accounted for approximately 57.2% of all permits issued. Agriculture type permits accounted for 13.3% of all permits issued while Septic type permits accounted for 11.4% of all permits issued. A total value of \$349,660.66 was collected for Building Permit Fees in 2023. A total of 678 Building Inspections were completed in 2023. A 5-year comparison of Building Department Statistics has been included for Council's information purposes. Identified is a decrease in overall permit numbers in 2023 compared to previous years statistics, the Estimated Value of Construction exceeds previous year values within the 5 year review period and permit fees collected remain comparable to fees collected in 2022.


