Report:

Background:

This report is in response to a 'Petition for Drainage Works by Owners - Form 1', received from Ms. Patricia Botter, 59 Franklin Avenue, Guelph, ON, N1E 4M8. The petition has been signed by Ms. Patricia Botter.

The petitioner is requesting a sufficient outlet for approximately 18.6 hectares of their property located at Lot 19, Concession 11 in the former Township of Greenock. The closest sufficient outlet for this property is the Dales Municipal Drain which is currently being designed. The requested outlet could therefore be incorporated into the Dales Municipal Drain as a separate branch drain.

Analysis:

It is recommended that the Municipality of Brockton accept the petition and proceed with the appointment of a Drainage Engineer.
