New Sun-Filter blinds have been installed, and a new storm window was donated by Premier Windows to cover the only operating window in the building.

# Unplanned, but budgeted-for major long-term repairs:

**Elevator-** Early in January the elevator required major work, costing close to \$5000. **Furnace-** One of the five furnaces required replacement at a cost of~ \$4500.



Air Conditioning Unit - on the Opera Hall Roof required replacement- ~\$4500

**Sewer Repair:** After much exploration, a permanent fix has been found for our chronic sewer problems. Cost ~\$3500.
