Recommendation:

That the Council of the Municipality of Brockton hereby receives Report Number PW2025-06 – 2025 Tenders for Product or Services - Single Surface Treatment, prepared by Nicholas Schnurr, Director of Operations, and in doing so accepts the 2025 Tender Results and awards the contract to Miller Paving Limited: at \$1.74/liter of oil and \$77.42/tonne of aggregate, excluding HST.

Report:

Background:

Single Surface Treatment means a single application of bituminous binder (ie. HFRS-2) followed by a single application of Class 6 aggregate and must conform to Ontario Provincial Standard Specification (OPSS) 304.

In 2025, Staff are proposing to apply Single Surface Treatment to approximately 12 kms of road in Brockton, the equivalent of approximately 176,232 Litres of HFRS-2 bituminous binder (oil) and approximately 1,200 tonnes of Class 6 Aggregate.

Staff put out an RFQ to the previously two lowest bidders to have this work completed as per our procurement process. Miller Paving Limited came in with the lowest bid. Staff are satisfied with the tender results as outlined below.

Analysis:

Staff recommend that the Council of the Municipality of Brockton accept and award the contract to the lowest tender, Miller Paving Limited at \$1.74/litre of oil and \$77.42/ tonne of aggregate. For an estimated 12 km, this results in a cost of \$399,547.68, included in the 2025 operations budget.
