

Additionally in May, local students from Bruce and Grey Counties will be encouraged to apply for the Walkerton Clean Water Legacy Award through Community Foundation Grey Bruce. This scholarship, established in 2020, supports students pursuing careers in environmental science or clean water management. Promoting the Legacy Award offers another meaningful way for the community to recognize the past while supporting advancement for the future.

Finally, the Municipality will collaborate with the Walkerton Clean Water Centre to offer public tours of the Technology Demonstration Facility on a Saturday in May. Established in 2004, the Walkerton Clean Water Centre works to enhance drinking water systems across Ontario. The state-of-the-art facility provides demonstrations of drinking water technology, operator training, and water system education. The tours will highlight how Walkerton is now recognized as a hub for education, information, and guidance on ensuring clean, safe water for communities throughout Ontario.
