Your input will help the County understand local environmental priorities, identify challenges and opportunities, and shape meaningful actions the County and community can take together.

The Environmental Sustainability Action Plan will serve as a roadmap to guide practical, collaborative actions that support environmental stewardship, climate adaptation and long-term sustainability. The plan will also advance a key priority in [Bruce County’s Strategic Plan](#): building capacity to adapt to and mitigate the impacts of climate change.

The Environmental Sustainability Action Plan will focus on key areas where Bruce County can lead and collaborate regionally, including forest conservation, waste management, active and sustainable transportation, climate change mitigation and adaptation, and fostering partnerships and environmental awareness.

Community Feedback

Community feedback will play a vital role in shaping the plan and guiding Bruce County's path toward a more resilient, climate-conscious future.

In addition to the survey, County staff are engaging directly with municipal partners, Indigenous rights-holders, agencies, and key community stakeholders to gather diverse perspectives and ensure the plan reflects shared values and goals.
