#### **Recommendation:**

That the Council of the Municipality of Brockton hereby receives Report Number PW2019-10 - Greenock Landfill Operations, prepared by John Strader, Roads Supervisor, and in doing so supports maintaining the current hours of operation at the Greenock Landfill.

#### Report:

#### **Background:**

A concern from a Greenock resident was brought forward to Council on January 22, 2019 regarding the operating hours of the Greenock Landfill during the weekdays. A suggestion was made to staff to review the possibility of reopening the Greenock Landfill for an additional weekday.

#### **Analysis**:

Staff recommend that the operational days at the Greenock Landfill remain status quo. In 2015, the operational days were adjusted at the Greenock Landfill and the suggestion to open the Greenock Landfill throughout the week was not financially ideal since the municipality were paying increased wages, and the operational costs were higher than the amount of revenue generated by the Greenock Landfill.

Currently, the Greenock Landfill is open Saturdays from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The Brant Landfill is open for the following hours:

April 1st to October 31st

Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

Saturdays from 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.

November 1<sup>st</sup> to March 31<sup>st</sup>

Wednesdays from 9:00 a.m. to - 3:00 p.m.

Saturdays from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

However, effective April 1<sup>st</sup> 2019, the Saturday hours at both the Greenock and Brant Landfills will be changed to 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. as per Resolution 19-02-08 which was passed by Brockton Council at the January 22, 2019 Council Meeting. The resolution has been attached to this report for Council's information.

Under the Certificate of Approval, Greenock residents are allowed to dispose their garbage in the Brant Landfill since the Greenock Landfill is only a transfer station. Going forward, staff will ensure that Greenock residents are made aware that they can utilize the Brant Landfill during the weekday operating hours.
