



The Municipality of Brockton received a total of 23 complaints from May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2025, to July 31<sup>st</sup>, 2025. Of these, 13 are now inactive and will be monitored for continued compliance. Staff will proceed with efforts to achieve voluntary compliance or take necessary enforcement actions for the remaining 10 active matters.

The following chart provides an overview of by-law enforcement activity related to formal complaint matters within the Municipality of Brockton. These numbers do not reflect ongoing by-law matters or files that have been re-opened due to reoccurring violations of a municipal by-law.

Due to recent activity, staff are reminding residents that By-law 99-88 prohibits the keeping of certain animals and classes of animals within the municipality. Prohibited animals include:

- All Felids (cats) except the Felis Domesticus (common house cat)
- All Canidae (dogs) except the Canis Domesticus (common dog)
- All Non-Human Primates (i.e.: Gorillas, Baboons, Monkeys)
- All snakes of the Families Pythonidae and Boidae (such as Pythons and Boa Constructors)
- All Crocodilians (such as Alligators and Crocodiles)
- All venomous or poisonous Snakes, Spiders, Lizards or Scorpions

**False Alarms**

The False Alarm By-Law 2022-043 aims to reduce unnecessary police calls and reallocate resources to higher-priority issues within the municipality. The accompanying statistics provide an overview of false alarms for May and June. Please note that July data was not available at the time of preparing this report and will be included on the next activity report.
