Walkerton Lawn Bowling Club history

- Established in 1888.
- Located at 207 Jane Street since 1898.
- The oldest active club in OLBA District 8.
- 48 full-time members in 2024 and growing.
- The Club operates a student program with WDCS and SHSS physical education classes.
- Many tournaments are hosted here throughout the season that brings in other provincial clubs.
- Lawn bowling is a fun strategic outdoor game for everyone; not just Seniors.

Budget Request Summary

1. Replace fence along Jane Street and install fence between the Walkerton Lawn Bowling Club and the old Armoury building.
2. Extend the existing shelter approximately 16', including a concrete pad, as a base for the entire structure.
3. Security light on the hydro pole on Jane Street that will direct light to the South. This will provide light for anyone entering and exiting at Jane Street as well as security lighting.
4. Replace the existing storage shed that is aging and in disrepair with a 12'x16' storage shed to store equipment.

Fence Repair

- Many areas of the fence along Jane Street are damaged and in disrepair.
- A great deal of work and resources goes into creating and maintaining a greens surface. The fence is a barrier to minimize damage to the surface from non-members using the surface for purposes other than intended.
- Install a fence along the property line between the old Armoury building (residence) and the WLBC property.
- An entrance gate is required for vehicles and personnel to enter/exit from Victoria Street South.
