





DETACHMENT UPDATES

- The one Sexual Assault reported during this time period the Suspect was known to the Victim.
- None of the Assaults in February were Domestic related.
- Break and Enters and Theft Over occurrences are down slightly while Theft Under had a slight increase.
- We are continuing with our Pocket Your Keys campaign encouraging the community to help prevent property crimes. We are also engaging our Auxiliary Unit to complete some Lock or Lose It campaigns as well as Safe Guard Assessments for victims of property crime.
- The increase in Frauds continues to be of concern. The Frauds/Scams are becoming
 more creative in nature. In the month of February we had reported a case of Identity
 Theft with a large monetary amount lost, a Loan Fraud with money lost, an on-line fraud
 with money lost. Some recent fraud attempts come under the guise of a known email
 address. Two of the reported frauds were unfounded.
- March is Fraud Prevention Month. Our Community Safety Officer has posted media releases throughout the month targeting a different fraud/scam in each release. She has also given half a dozen Fraud prevention presentations to community groups in the month of March.
- The two Drug Possession occurrences involved overdoses. In both cases the victims were revived by officers utilizing Narcan.
- We are down in both Property and Personal Injury Motor Vehicle collisions.
 40% was due to inclement weather. One person was charged with Impaired by Drug.
 Another collision was a Fail to Remain, suspected to be an Impaired Driver.

At the beginning of March we had a complaint about Motorized Snow Machine traffic
on the Saugeen River Trail. Officers were asked to include the entrances on their patrols
to observe for this activity. The School Resource Officer was going to address it with
students at the school seen driving MSVs.
