Sue's Story: 100 Years of Strength, Spirit and Community

Sue Paquette joined the YMCA in 1995 when she moved from Tobermory to Owen Sound after her husband had a stroke and was moved to Summit Place. As a mother of five, she had always been active, but this move marked the beginning of a new chapter, and a search for connection and strength.

"I didn't know a soul in Owen Sound," she recalls. "I thought I'd join the Y to meet people and to stay strong, physically and mentally, for my husband. That's when I met Dianne. She took me over and got me out of the dumps. We've been friends ever since."

The Y Becomes Her Anchor

The YMCA became her anchor. At one point, Sue couldn't walk and arrived in a wheelchair. "Dianne told me, 'Get in the water and walk,' and I did," she says. "Whenever I could get to the Y, that was my goal."

When she lost her husband, Sue also faced difficult financial times. The YMCA's Financial Assistance Program helped carry her through. "The Y is always there for me," she says. "It's everything to me."

Stay Active, Staying Connected

At 100 years of age, Sue is still a force of nature. She comes to the YMCA three times a week and plays cards with friends twice a week.



"My friends always ask if I'm coming next week. They take care of me," she says with a smile. "Everyone says hello to me, even if I don't know them, they know me!"

The YMCA has been a steady source of friendship, movement, and motivation. "I don't know where I'd be without it, probably just sitting in a chair at home," she says. "Instead, my daughter tells me I have more of a life than she does!"

Resilience and Determination

Even after breaking her leg, Sue was determined to return. “My goal was to come back. Just hang on to the wall and get in the water,” she says. Her resilience and bright spirit continue to inspire everyone around her.

She’s always been active, from yoga with her mom as a child in Tobermory, to exercises at the community hall, cross-country skiing, and lifting weights at the Y. She was still doing curls in the gym at 97, and she’s not done yet.

“You have to stay active,” she says. “If I’m going to be the age that I am, you have to stay well.”

Shining at 100

At 100 years old, Sue continues to Shine On and shows us all what it means to live with purpose, connection, and heart.

The Power of Connection

Sue’s journey is a reminder that the YMCA is more than a place to work out - it’s a place to belong. Whether it’s forming lifelong friendships, finding strength during difficult times, or simply hearing your name when you walk through the door, the YMCA connects people of all ages and stages of life. It brings together children, families, and seniors in a shared space where everyone can grow, give back, and shine.

At the heart of our mission is community, and stories like Sue’s show just how powerful that can be.

Helping Logan Shine: A Mother's Gratitude for YMCA Child Care

At the YMCA, our Child Care program is built on more than play and learning, it is rooted in belonging, caring, respect, and igniting each child's unique potential. Every day, our dedicated educators create spaces where children are celebrated for who they are and supported in who they can become. Logan's story is a powerful reminder of the impact our educators have, not only on children's growth, but on the hearts of families across our community.

Here is what Logan's mother had to say about their family's experience at our YMCA Child Care - Kincardine program:

When our son Logan, who is autistic and non speaking, started at the YMCA daycare, we didn't know exactly what to expect. What we found was the most incredible care we could have ever hoped for.

From day one, his teachers saw him for who he is. They met him with the utmost patience, love, and the kind of dedication that goes far beyond the everyday. I have always said how blown away I am by the care he received. As his Mom I know the day to day can be hard with a special needs child, they embraced everything with grace.

They celebrated his victories, supported him through challenges, and always made sure he felt safe and included.

There was never a moment of doubt in our minds about how much they cared for Logan and how deeply they wanted to see him grow.

And grow he did—thriving in ways that filled us with so much gratitude and joy. I think Logan wouldn't be where he's at today, conquering the beginning of junior kindergarten without all their love and guidance.

I write this in tears because as a Mom to a child with special needs you always worry if they'll be accepted and loved, I can truly say the teachers he had loved him for who he is, despite the struggles, despite the challenges.

The YMCA Child Care gave Logan more than a place to spend his days; it gave him a community where he was understood, supported, and truly valued. For that, we will always be thankful.

A Year of Growth, Grants, and Community Impact

The YMCA of Owen Sound Grey Bruce continues to shine as a hub of community strength, thanks to the incredible generosity of donors, partners, and foundations. Over the past year, vital grants and community contributions have helped expand programs, strengthen services, and ensure that individuals and families across Grey and Bruce Counties have access to health, wellness, housing, and support.



Enhancing Facilities and Accessibility

Through a \$17,300 Capital grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation, the YMCA upgraded the heating system in its aquatics centre, ensuring consistent pool temperatures, improved energy efficiency, and uninterrupted programming. The new system not only reduces operating costs but also enhances the comfort for swim lessons, therapy programs, and fitness classes.

By improving the conditions for participants and instructors, this upgrade strengthens the effectiveness of our aquatic programs, helping everyone feel supported, safe and motivated to stay active.



Accessibility also took a leap forward this year thanks to a ParticipACTION Community Challenge grant, which enabled the YMCA to purchase a specialized water wheelchair for the aquatics centre. This equipment allows individuals with mobility challenges to fully participate in aquatic programs, creating a more inclusive environment where everyone can experience the physical, social, and mental health benefits of water-based activity.

Supporting Housing and Homelessness



Another milestone gift of \$25,300 from 100 Women Who Care Grey Bruce went directly to the YMCA's Stepping Stone to Home Apartment Start-Up Fund. This fund provides essential household items like bedding, cookware, and utensils, helping individuals and families transition from homelessness to permanent housing with dignity and stability.

The YMCA's Homelessness Response Program received a \$16,500 boost from Bruce Power, helping expand shelter capacity during the winter months. Between October and December 2024, the YMCA provided 1,255 nights of shelter and supported more than 50 people in finding stable housing. With over 250 people unhoused in Grey-Bruce, this investment came at a critical time.



Breaking Down Barriers with the Strong Communities Fund

At the YMCA, we believe financial circumstances should never hold anyone back. This year, the Eva Leflar Foundation donated \$10,000 to the Strong Communities Fund, Zehrs Owen Sound raised over \$700, and the Cobble Beach Lighthouse Fun Run drew 225 participants and raised nearly \$5,900, helping hundreds of families, youth, and seniors access swimming, youth programs, and fitness activities. Together, we're shining brighter and breaking down barriers for all.



A Life Rebuilt: From Streets to Stability

Since 2022, one local resident has faced unimaginable challenges. After a serious car accident left them with life-changing injuries, they experienced a prolonged period of homelessness, relying on emergency shelter, staying with family and friends for short periods, and facing the instability of constantly moving. Through it all, the YMCA of Owen Sound Grey Bruce's Homeless Response team was a consistent source of support.

Resilience in Action

With unwavering determination, this individual embraced every opportunity to rebuild their life. Over the past year, they have remained substance-free, completed the last two credits needed to earn their high school diploma, and leaned on YMCA programs for support. The Y's core values of belong, caring, honesty, respect and responsibility have been the foundation for their recovery, empowering them to focus on long-term goals rather than their hardships.

A Safe Place to Call Home

In June 2025, their persistence paid off. With the help of their YMCA Rural Homelessness Outreach Worker, they secured safe, stable housing, a critical milestone that provided the security needed to plan for the future.

Looking Forward

Today, they are preparing to take the next step in their journey by starting post-secondary studies in Addictions Counselling this September. Their goal is not only personal growth but also to create a brighter future for their two young daughters.

This story is one of struggle, hope and transformation. With the YMCA's support, this individual has moved from crisis to stability.

YMCA Rural Housing & Homeless Outreach

Homelessness can happen to anyone. It is often the result of systemic barriers, unaffordable housing, job loss, health challenges, or unexpected life events.

YMCA Rural Housing and Homelessness Outreach works to prevent, address and reduce homelessness in our community.

We do this by:

- Assisting people in need of emergency shelter
- Providing advocacy and referrals to community services
- Working with individuals and families to create and implement an action plan to secure long term sustainable housing that meets their needs

Celebrating Diwali: Building Belonging Through Community

In alignment with our strategic priority to champion community well-being, and our objective to lead by example, the YMCA proudly hosted our annual Diwali celebration on November 2, 2024.



This event brought together newcomers, community members, and supporters in a colorful display of unity and belonging, providing an opportunity to experience the warmth and joy of Diwali. Organized by our Settlement team in collaboration with Georgian College, the celebration reflected our shared commitment to promote inclusivity and cultural appreciation. Open to everyone, it was an invitation to share in a meaningful cultural experience that fosters connections, understanding, and a shared sense of belonging in the community.

“Events like Diwali show us that community is built not only by the programs we run, but by the way we come together to celebrate each other.” says Matt Shute, Director of Community Initiatives and Employment Services.

Guests enjoyed traditional Indian music and dance performances, intricate rangoli designs, and a variety of traditional Indian foods, offering a taste of the rich culinary heritage associated with Diwali. A special lamp-lighting ceremony, symbolizing hope and unity, was completed by Warden of Grey County, Brian Milne.



With over 200 attendees, this annual event shines a light on *belonging*, one of our YMCA core values, while celebrating diversity and fostering connections.

Investing in Financial Stability for the Future

Aligned with our strategic priority of financial stability, the YMCA of Owen Sound Grey Bruce is taking thoughtful steps to ensure long-term sustainability.

If February 2025, the YMCA of Owen Sound Grey Bruce took important steps to strengthen our long-term sustainability through a modest 2% membership adjustment and the introduction of a “Refresh My Y” fee. These changes ensure we can continue to provide the exceptional programs, facilities, and experiences our members rely on while keeping our services accessible to everyone.

The Refresh My Y fee is dedicated to ongoing reinvestment in our facilities—from pool maintenance and equipment upgrades to creating safe, welcoming spaces for all. As a charity, this step allows us to maintain high-quality experiences today while planning responsibly for the future.

Even with these adjustments, YMCA memberships remain among the most affordable in our region, offering far more than a traditional gym. From swimming and aquatics programs to group fitness, wellness classes, and youth recreation, every membership provides access to a wide range of activities designed to support health, belonging, and community connection.

These changes are not only about keeping our YMCA strong today—they’re about building stability and ensuring that our community can shine for generations to come.



Celebrating Community Leaders

These stories of leadership reflect our strategic priority to champion community well-being. Together with inspiring community partners and leaders, the YMCA continues to advance belonging and build stronger, more connected communities.

King Charles III Coronation Medal

This past year, the YMCA celebrated the achievements of Tom Rice and Sonya Mount, recipients of the King Charles III Coronation Medal. Their leadership of the Julie McArthur Regional Recreation Centre Capital Campaign raised an incredible \$6.3 million, far surpassing the goal and ensuring the facility could continue to shine as a center of health, fitness, and connection. Their vision and perseverance secured a long-term impact for our region—helping people of all ages access the supports they need to grow stronger in spirit, mind, and body.



Peace Medal

The YMCA of Owen Sound Grey Bruce proudly honored Joan John and Barb Vandendor with the 2024 Peace Medal for their outstanding work fostering inclusion, compassion, and belonging in Grey and Bruce Counties.

Through their dedication to supporting marginalized groups, youth, and individuals experiencing homelessness, Joan and Barb exemplify how leadership and service create stronger, more connected communities.



Exceptional Experiences Through Exceptional Spaces

At the YMCA of Owen Sound Grey Bruce, we are committed to our Strategic Priority of Exceptional Experiences by delivering on our Strategic Objective of Exceptional Services. This means ensuring our spaces and services support well-being today and for generations to come.

This past year, we made significant progress on this goal:

Investing in Spaces that Serve

To enhance service delivery and increase efficiency, our Community Initiatives, Employment Services, Settlement Services and Administration teams moved into a new location at 290 9th Street East, Owen Sound. This relocation, part of a larger consolidation effort, brings more of our YMCA staff together under one roof. The move strengthens downtown Owen Sound, improves access for the public, and ensures we can continue providing responsive and impactful services to individuals and families across the region.

This move was made possible through a strong partnership with Awsman Group Inc., who share our vision of strengthening Owen Sound's downtown core and creating spaces that foster community well-being. Together, we have reimagined the former Sun Times building into a barrier-free, centrally located, 12,000-square-foot space designed to serve staff, clients, and the broader community.

With ample room for growth, this new facility allows us to bring staff teams together under one roof, improve accessibility, and create a welcoming environment that supports collaboration and connection. This move was an investment in belonging, inclusion, and the long-term vitality of Grey and Bruce Counties by the YMCA and Awsman owner, Andy Smit.



Expanding Child Care Capacity in Ripley

In September 2024, we celebrated the re-opening of Child Care - Ripley in its freshly renovated space.

The revitalized space is brighter, more spacious, and now licensed to welcome more toddlers and preschoolers than ever before.



While we continue to address staffing shortages that challenge the entire child care sector, we remain dedicated to ensuring children and families have access to safe, nurturing, and high-quality care.

This renovated space was made possible through the support of local partners including the Township of Huron-Kinloss, the County of Bruce, and the Province of Ontario.

Strengthening Partnerships for the Future

The City of Owen Sound and YMCA of Owen Sound Grey Bruce announced a new 20-year operational agreement, securing a shared vision for accessible recreation in our community.

Since the onset of the partnership between the City and the YMCA in 2009, which secured federal and provincial funding as well as spearheaded a community fundraising campaign to construct the regional multi-purpose recreation centre, the City and the YMCA have worked together in the spirit of mutual collaboration, respect and support in pursuit of the common goal to provide long-term access to quality recreation services in Owen Sound. **This partnership between the city and the YMCA continues to build a community where everyone can ignite their potential.**
