Re: Development of Community Safety and Well-Being Plans in Bruce County

Dear Mr. Clarke,

We are sending this letter to follow up on our previous correspondence directed to Murray Clarke's attention and dated May 1, 2019.

As you are aware, recent changes to the *Police Services Act* R.S.O. 1990, c. P.15 requires all municipalities to develop and adopt a Community Safety and Well-Being Plan, which must also include a multi-sectoral advisory committee. Many of the municipalities in the County of Bruce share police services and other resources, and the Municipality of Brockton supports a collaborative approach to developing a Community Safety and Well-Being Plan.

As many of the services of the Community Safety and Well-Being Plan are within the jurisdiction of the County of Bruce, the Municipality of Brockton is requesting that the County of Bruce spearhead this collaborative approach, and further confirms support for a dedicated Coordinator to facilitate the development of these plans.

Please see the following resolution that was adopted by Council of the Municipality of Brockton at the Council Meeting on April 23, 2019.

That the Council of the Municipality of Brockton hereby receives Report Number CAO2019-10 -Community Safety and Well-Being Plans, prepared by Sonya Watson, Chief Administrative Officer for information purposes, and in doing so supports a letter being sent to the County of Bruce suggesting a collaborative approach to the Community Safety and Well-Being Plans would be beneficial to the lower tier municipalities across the County; and

Further that Brockton Council requests that the County of Bruce lead the collaborative group or initiates discussion with the Grey Bruce Health Unit; and

Further that Brockton Council acknowledges that support towards a staff resource in the form of a project coordinator may be required.
