- **Everglades of the North:** Over the past three years, OPG has funded efforts to conserve the <u>Minesing Wetlands</u>, a 60-square-kilometres tract west of Barrie. With the help of volunteers, the Nature Conservancy of Canada has planted thousands of trees to buffer the wetland's waterways and protect habitat for rare and endangered species.
