# **DETACHMENT UPDATES**

- Sexual Assaults were up over this time period and continue to be up Year to Date. Charges have been laid in one instance while another is still under active investigation. In two instances, the victims have declined to proceed at this time.
- Assaults are status quo during this time period compared to 2018 but are still down Year to Date. Over 50% were Domestic related. The remainder involved a Child Abuse allegation, a Family Dispute, and an Assault Police charge.
- Other Crimes Against a Person are up slightly for this time period but again down overall
  for Year to Date. These investigations usually coincide with the Domestic investigation
  involved charges such as Threatening.
- Break and Enters were down and continue to be down Year to Date. One of them was
  deemed unfounded while two of the other investigations have similar Persons of
  Interest that are being investigated.
- Theft Over investigations remain status quo for the time period and Year to Date. These thefts involve larger items such as trailers, large quantities of tools or motor vehicles.
- Theft Under investigations are down significantly for both the summer months and Year to Date.
- Fraud is down slightly for this time period and continues to trend downward Year to
  Date. Unfortunately this summer we had three victims who lost money, in a couple
  cases significant amounts. These Frauds ranged from the Grandparent Scam, Romance
  Scam and the CRA scam. We continue to produce media releases in attempts to educate
  the general public about these frauds and provide regular presentations to community
  groups.
- Mischiefs continue to be down over the summer months and Year to Date. Unfortunately Municipal property was targeted with graffiti on a number of occasions and in one instance rocks were placed in a water bucket at the Splash Pad. This was thankfully discovered prior to any children getting hurt. Graffiti has been reported on the bridge by the Tim Horton's, on the dam and at the Pavilion.

- Graffiti and debris located along the Saugeen River Trail system identified that there
  may be some camping occurring along the trails. Foot patrols were conducted
  throughout the summer and in more than one instance people were located and moved
  along. In at least one situation it was a case of homelessness and it is suspected that this
  is the case in other situations.
- The South Bruce OPP Community Street Crimes Unit (CSCU) conducted a Search Warrant in Walkerton in August 2019. This warrant resulted in the arrest of two individuals and multiple charges. Almost 2 Kgs of Methamphetamine was seized in the search. This is a large seizure and should have a significant impact on drug activity and the associated criminal activity in Brockton and surrounding areas. A related and subsequent investigation led to the Huron-Perth CSCU conducting two Search Warrants which resulted in the seizure of another 2 Kgs of Methamphetamine. The combined amount of just over 4 Kgs of Meth is equivalent to almost half a million dollars of product.
- We are down in both Property and Personal Injury Motor Vehicle collisions. One third of the Property Damage collisions involve striking an animal. Almost 25% involve collisions that occur in parking lots.
- South Bruce OPP officers participated in Traffic Safety Campaigns on both the Canada Day and Civic Holiday Long weekends. The August long weekend resulted in over 80 speeding charges laid, four of which were Racing charges (over 50 km/hour over the speed limit).
- RIDE grant paperwork has been completed, submitted and approved by the Ministry.
   This funding will be utilized for Paid Duties in Brockton during the Festive RIDE season.
- Assistance was provided to the Municipality of Brockton Staff regarding MVC statistics involving the corner of Durham and McNabb. MVC statistics over a 5 year period showed minimal collisions in that area.
- In August our two School Resource Officers (SROs) along with their supervisor attended
  a meeting with Brockton Staff, the Tobacco Enforcement Officer and members of
  Walkerton District High School regarding complaints of students smoking just off school
  property in a nearby residential area. Complaints include students standing out on the
  street, foul language and littering. A number of solutions were discussed. The South

Bruce OPP SROs will continue to monitor the situation and have historically engaged students around the concerns. This issue is one that requires Community Mobilization and Engagement and should not be left as solely an Enforcement solution.

- On August 17<sup>th</sup>, a group called Anonymous for the Voiceless organized a Protest in downtown Walkerton. Their goal to hold the protest had been advertised in the Hanover Post. A subsequent counter-protest was also organized by a group of business owners to host a Beef BBQ in support of local farmers. The South Bruce OPP had been made aware of these events through unrelated parties. The role of the OPP in relation to protests is to ensure Public Safety. The OPP has a specially trained team called the Provincial Liaison Team (PLT). These officers are trained in relationship building and mediation. PLT was engaged by the Detachment Commander for these events. The PLT officers liaised with the organizers of both groups, ensuring they were aware of the right to peaceful protest, the importance of public safety etc. PLT then attended the events to continue that liaison. Both groups were able to hold their events with little disruption.
- The first week of September is the return to school. All officers are tasked with increased patrols and enforcement in school zones including foot patrol at the schools themselves. Reminders have gone out through the media that kids will be excited and that drivers should be cautious.
