### Recommendation:

That the Council of the Municipality of Brockton hereby approves Report Number REC2019-21 –Bruce Power Regional Soccer Field Drainage, prepared by Mike Murphy, Interim Director of Parks and Recreation for information and in doing so authorizes the issuance of a Request for Proposals (RFP) for the installation of drainage and top dressing for two soccer fields with the work to be completed in the spring and funded from the 2020 capital budget.

### Report:

#### Background:

In 2018 it was identified that the fields at Bruce Power Regional Soccer Facility required drainage in order to improve the playing surface and increase the playable hours.

#### Analysis:

In 2019 drainage for the first two of four fields was approved and completed September 10, 2019. In order to complete the drainage project on the remaining two fields in spring 2020 staff need to issue an RFP for the project so it can be scheduled and completed in early spring allowing the fields to be ready for the 2020 soccer season.
