## 5. Business Arising from the Minutes

#### 6. New Business – Spruce the Bruce Updates

6.1 Walkerton Storefront Project – Paulette Peirol

Three storefronts are now participating, 417 and 419 Durham St. West, (the former Make & Take) and A Little Bit Of Everything, also on Durham Street. P. Peirol said signs to arrive soon.

We've spent approximately \$2,500 on signage and props and could purchase a few more items, possibly a bistro table, bookshelf, small electric fireplace.

The CIC committee was in favour of spending additional money on storefront marketing items

6.2 Coming Events Signage – Alishia Oberle, Paulette Peirol

All three signs have been installed and the invoice for \$4,442 from Cox Signs has been submitted for payment.

The CIC committee discussed adding two more sets of panels, as there is still budget for this. The approximate cost is \$1,200. A. Oberle will take send the new panel designs directly to Cox Signs.

#### 6.3 Sidewalks Project – Paulette Peirol

The project is now completed, however the Municipality is holding back on final payment to the contractor until various surface treatments are fixed. There was also some damage to the downtown map in front of the library, which will also be fixed. A. Oberle said the BIA can create a new map face from its existing files. The BIA will work with Brockton staff to ensure the sign is repaired.

### 6.2 Lobies Park Boat Launch – Eric McDougall

The boat launch is complete, and we are awaiting an invoice from the Saugeen Valley Conservation Authority for our portion of the project (\$5,000). Boat launch signs have been ordered from Cox Signs. Cost is approximately \$220.

#### 6.3 Optimist Park – Wayne Poechman, Brian Folmer

W. Poechman said there is a concern still with the grading at the entrance to the park, and that the Municipality should erect signage, or fencing, to warn users of the potential hazard. Staff will follow up on this.

The Optimist Park water drop sculpture is coming along, with hopes that it will be installed soon. It is painted, and the sign has been completed by Freiburger Welding. We are waiting for locates before installing.

# 7. Proposed Projects for 2020

# 7.1 Photo Murals (Brockton Heritage Committee)

The committee discussed a request from the Brockton Heritage Committee to assist in erecting at least three new historic photo murals downtown, to replace the ones currently in place, which are deteriorating. The committee is in favour of this, providing the Heritage Committee take the lead on the project, with the CIC assisting with the grant writing.

CIC members agreed to contribute \$2,500 in funding towards the project in 2020, pending approval under the Spruce the Bruce program.

- 7.2 Saugeen River Trail Signage (Rotary Club)
- B. Folmer said the Walkerton Rotary Club has expressed interest in sprucing up signage along the Saugeen River Trail, but no commitment has been made. B. Folmer will follow up with the club.
- 7.3 Ideas from committee members

The following ideas were discussed by the CIC committee as possible projects:

- Downtown WiFi: Committee members agreed there is less of a need for it now with most people having data on their cell phones. Also, most stores are now allowing customers access to WiFi.
- Alley Animation: The alley beside the meat market could be animated with art-work, benches, lighting or sculptural elements.
- Remembrance Day Banners: Some municipalities in Bruce and Grey counties have special banners for Remembrance Day. However, it was felt that new Winter Banners would take precedence over this, as they could be hung for longer. B. Folmer expressed doubt that STB would fund another banner project for us in 2020.
- Truax Dam beautification: There was discussion about adding benches or other beautification elements to the Truax Dam area, now that the dam has been partially removed. C. Oberle said he believed the area was left intentionally bare, as it's a flood zone.
