Recommendation:

That the Council of the Municipality of Brockton hereby receives Report Number CLK2020-04 – Community Safety and Well-Being Plan Engagement Survey, prepared by Fiona Hamilton, Clerk for information purposes.

Report:

Background:

Staff have previously presented Report Number CAO2019-10 at the April 23, 2019 Council Meeting, Report Number CAO2019-19 at the August 13, 2019 Council Meeting, and Report Number CLK2019-43 at the December 17, 2019 Council Meeting outlining the legislative requirements for Municipalities to adopt a Community Safety and Well-Being Plan by January 2021.

The Municipality of Brockton has joined forces with fifteen other lower-tier municipalities, Bruce and Grey Counties, eight police services, and more than 30 education, health and social service organizations across Bruce and Grey to prepare a Community Safety and Well-Being Plan (CSWBP).

Analysis:

The Community Safety and Well-Being Plan Committee has launched a community engagement survey through their website www.cswbp-brucegrey.ca and have provided printed copies of the survey to the Municipality of Brockton which are available for residents to pick up from the Municipal Office during regular business hours. Staff have additionally placed printed surveys at the Walkerton and Cargill Libraries.

The survey, which is meant to be completed by residents of Bruce County or Grey County, will help the Committee understand the current state of well-being and feelings of safety of the residents of Bruce and Grey so we can work together to focus on local actions to improve the quality of life for everyone. The survey is confidential and responses will be stored on secure servers at Grey County and the Grey Bruce Health Unit.

The survey will be available until midnight on March 22, 2020.

In addition, staff have added the Community Safety and Well-Being Plan information as a project on our new community engagement site, www.buildyourbrockton.ca. Residents are able to inquire for further information, and provide ideas to help us support Brockton's Community Safety and Well-Being Plan.

Community engagement sessions will also be held in the future to gather feedback from residents. Approximately two (2) sessions will be held in Brockton, as well as a session at the County of Bruce. More information will be distributed to Council as it becomes available.
