- A number of arrests were made in the winter months of 2019 of individuals known to be responsible for Property Crimes across the South Bruce area. Property Crime investigations and arrests continued throughout the year. We were hopeful that these arrests would contribute to a decrease in our property crimes and victims. Year end statistics show that we have seen a decrease in Break and Enters and Theft Under and Over \$5000.00 in the Brockton area.
- The South Bruce OPP Community Street Crimes Unit (CSCU) conducted a Search Warrant in Walkerton in August. This warrant resulted in the arrest of two individuals and multiple charges. Almost 2 Kgs of Methamphetamine was seized in the search. A related and subsequent investigation led to the Huron-Perth CSCU conducting two Search Warrants which resulted in the seizure of another 2 Kgs of Methamphetamine. The combined amount of just over 4 Kgs of Meth is equivalent to almost half a million dollars of product. These warrants had a significant impact on drug activity and the associated criminal activity in South Bruce and surrounding areas.

- We welcomed six new recruits to South Bruce in this past year. These recruits come from a variety of backgrounds, have all relocated to the area and are contributing to the safety of South Bruce.
- South Bruce also promoted one of our own this past year. D/C Ryan OLDHAM was promoted to Sgt and has taken over the leadership of our D platoon. Sgt OLDHAM replaces Sgt Chris GRAHAM who retired early in 2019 after proudly serving over 30 years with the OPP.
- Six of our officers received rewards and recognition this year for Life Saving. These officers were all awarded Life Saving Awards by St. John's Ambulance and were recognized by the OPP Commissioner for their Life Saving actions during four separate calls for service.

- Our School Resource Officers identified 30 youth across the South Bruce jurisdiction to attend an OPP/Tim Horton's Youth Camp in May.
- South Bruce OPP has partnered with Victim Services to introduce Project Life Saver. Project Life Saver is technology in the form of a bracelet that is worn by the recipient who may be at risk of wandering. The bracelet emits a signal that can be detected by a receiver. South Bruce OPP officers will be trained to utilize the receiver in order for them to quickly locate the individual if they have been reported as missing.

- South Bruce OPP has joined with all Grey-Bruce Municipal Police Services, the Grey-Bruce OPP and the three Hospital groups in Grey-Bruce to form a Police/Hospital Committee. As a group we are working towards a standard Transfer of Care protocol across Grey-Bruce. This will ensure consistent and smooth transition of Mental Health patients from police to hospital staff improving outcomes for individuals apprehended by police under the Mental Health Act.
- Community Safety and Well Being planning (CSWBP) has started across Grey-Bruce. Insp Krista MILLER currently sits on the Steering Committee for this group. Establishing a Municipal CSWBP will identify risk factors, create strategies to address those risks and mitigate the underlying social issues that contribute to Crime.

- In partnership with the Kincardine Police Services Board we were successful in obtaining a three year Community Safety and Policing Grant in order to address Sexual Violence and Harassment as well as Human Trafficking. This grant will be used for Community Awareness Sessions, training for police and partner agencies as well as resources to assist Victims of these Crimes.
- We hosted three Community Awareness Sessions about Human Trafficking in Lucknow, Walkerton and Kincardine. All of these events were a huge success with approximately 300 people in attendance between the three events.

• The second year of the Community Safety and Well Being grant is focusing on youth. We have partnered with the Catholic District School Board as well as the Bluewater School Board to start to introduce Human Trafficking awareness into the curriculum. The goal is to create a video presentation that can be used in multiple schools and supported by the teachers and School Resource Officers.
