4. Delegations

4.1 Stuart Doyle, Barry's Construction and Insulation Ltd. - Subdivision Extension

Stuart Doyle, a representative for Barry's Construction and Insulation Ltd., informed Council that he was attending the meeting to provide an update to the proposed amendments to the Draft Plan of Subdivision. Mr. Doyle noted that the amendments were delayed as the proposed sale of lands from the East Ridge Business Park had just been finalized when the COVID-19 pandemic arrived and many engineering firms were reduced to limited numbers.

Mr. Doyle noted that Barry's was requesting an extension of only one (1) year. It was noted that the land extension agreement stipulated that Barry's would make a payment of \$10,000.00 in the event that an additional extension was requested. Mr. Doyle requested that the \$10,000.00 be waived due to the outside circumstances of the pandemic.

Mr. Doyle responded to questions from Council and confirmed that provided the planning process moved smoothly, Barry's was optimistic that construction could begin within the next year. Council discussed the construction of the road as a key component in further developing the East Ridge Business Park.

Council also discussed whether the \$10,000.00 should be waived or simply deferred for a single year. Council expressed support for the extension given the circumstances but emphasized the need to move forward on the development given the need for more housing in Brockton.

Mr. Doyle thanked Council for their consideration and the opportunity to speak about the revised plans.

14. New Business Brought Forward

1. Rural Water Testing Process

Councillor Lang noted that many rural residents were concerned that there was no plan in place by the Grey Bruce Health Unit to return to the previous arrangements for rural residents to have drinking water tested. Councillor Lang expressed support for rural residents to have their drinking water tested locally, rather than having to drive 45 minutes. It was noted that the issue had been raised at the Municipal Emergency Control Group with the representative at the Grey Bruce Health Unit and discussions were occurring to make arrangements for a central hub.

2. Smoking at Hinks Street and Fischer Dairy Road

Councillor Adams requested an update on the status of the by-law prohibiting smoking at the intersection of Hinks Street and Fischer Dairy Road. Fiona Hamilton, Clerk, noted that a draft would be presented for Council's consideration at the September 8, 2020 meeting.
