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### Recommendation:

That the Council of the Municipality of Brockton hereby receives Report Number CLK2020-36 - Community Safety and Well-Being Plan Project Update, prepared by Fiona Hamilton, Clerk for information purposes.

### Report:

#### Background:

On February 11, 2020, Staff brought forward Report Number CLK2020-04, providing an update on the Community Safety and Well-Being Plan (CSWBP) Engagement Survey. The Community Engagement Survey was distributed throughout Bruce and Grey Counties and was promoted by Brockton, and received positive feedback and engagement from members of the public, education, health, and social service organizations. Survey results were further distributed to each Municipality and County. The results were further used to identify the perceptions of risk in each community.

#### Analysis:

The CSWBP Steering and Advisory Committees had planned to host Community Engagement Sessions to gather feedback from residents, including two (2) sessions in Brockton, and a session at the County of Bruce which were all cancelled as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. The Committees met virtually to address the issues, identify risks, and put strategies and actions into place. Risk factors were identified, and action tables were created to identify existing services, and needs in order to address such risks.

A draft CSWBP is being created for Bruce and Grey Counties, and each Municipality will have a personalized Community Profile as part of the larger plan.

The current plan is for the draft CSWBP will be presented to the Councils for Grey and Bruce County first for endorsement, and then will further be distributed to Municipal Councils for approval. It is expected that Bruce

County Council will review the CSWBP in November, and it will be brought to Brockton Council in December of early into 2021 prior to the legislated deadline for adoption.

Once the plan has been adopted, the next step will be to ensure implementation of that plan. The Advisory Committee will be meeting to discuss the resources and arrangements that may be necessary to facilitate implementation of the plan and further details will be provided to Council when possible.
