Report:

Background:

This report summarizes the calls completed since May 4, 2020 when I initiated By-Law Enforcement Services for Brockton. This report summarizes the wide variety of issues that I have attended to in the community.

Analysis:

Covid-19 and related restrictions have impacted the Municipality in many ways this year. By-law operations and responding to complaints are continuing as normal, as the public has been submitting complaints via email and telephone to limit physical contact. Since Covid-19 restrictions and regulations have been in effect, by-law enforcement practices have only consisted of education for this matter so far. Fortunately, the Municipality has not received any complaints relating to Covid-19 that have escalated to an enforcement route. I will continue to educate and enforce municipal by-laws and strive to make our community safe, healthy and enjoyable for everyone.

The largest number of complaints this year is usually coming from animal control, but this year the fire restrictions arising from the pandemic and the weather conditions results in a large number of Open-Air Burn By-law matters.

The immediate plan is to conduct a targeted campaign focusing on winter parking restrictions to assist the snow plow operators. The intention will be to remind individuals early in the season of the importance of not interfering with snow removal such that additional enforcement will not be required later in the season. A round of warning letters have already been issued and the campaign will target areas with repeat violators.

The goal over the next few months is to try to increase education about effective preventative actions that can be taken to prevent the spread of Covid-19 and to continue to review and revise the enforceable by-laws. The plan to achieve this goal is to support the business community by frequenting area at high traffic times and remind individuals of the effectiveness of simple steps such as keeping physical distance, wearing a mask and washing hands frequently.
