Recommendation:

That the Council of the Municipality of Brockton hereby receives Report Number REC2021-06 – Skating Oval Usage Statistics, prepared by Mark Coleman, Director of Community Services, for information purposes.

Report:

Background:

From January 29 to February 26, 2021 the Brockton Parks and Recreation Department established and operated a 350m outdoor ice-skating oval at Lobies Park for public skating purposes to support physical activity and mental health during the 2nd wave of the COVID-19 pandemic. A COVID Safety and Operating Plan was put in place to control attendance and schedule usage via advance bookings. Up to 15 skaters per 45 minute time slot could book. The skating oval was operated 10:00am to 7:00pm daily Monday through Sunday. The oval was booked solid from 4pm each day and the entire day on weekends. During this period there were about 5 days of closure due to inclement weather (snow, wind or warm temperatures). The skating oval closed for the season on February 26th due to the early onset of spring weather conditions (daily temperatures above the freezing) resulting in deteriorating ice conditions and loss of ice.

Analysis:

Some 2,623+ skaters (adults, youth, seniors, families and schools groups) used the skating oval. Staff received positive feedback from many for the initiative and the quality if the skating trail. Many comments were also received hoping that skating oval would continue to offered in the future.

Most users heard about the initiative via the Municipality's social media, information bulletins and website channels and through word of mouth by residents.

This winter recreation initiative was sponsored financially by a \$15,000.00 donation from Bruce Power. The funding was primarily used to provide for a new winterized gatehouse/information kiosk for Lobies Park Campground for staff to work out of in controlling access to and use of the skating oval. The balance of funding was used for signage, supplies, slights and set-up of ice flooding equipment.

Pending direction to operate the skating oval in future winter seasons, the charging of a nominal fee for public skating could be implemented to help cover operating costs along with any corporate sponsorship or funding

from a local business. The continuation of this initiative will be presented in a staff report this fall seeking prebudget approval by Council as required to continue with the oval in early 2022.
