Recommendation:

That the Council of the Municipality of Brockton hereby receives Report Number REC2021-07 – Walkerton Agricultural Society Agreement, prepared by Mark Coleman, Director of Community Services and in doing so approves bringing forward a By-law for the Corporation of the Municipality of Brockton to enter into agreement with the Walkerton Agricultural Society.

Report:

Background:

For the past several years the Brockton Parks and Recreation Department and the Walkerton Agricultural Society maintained a mutually beneficial arrangement for seasonal and event specific use of each others buildings, property, tables, chairs and storage of equipment, etc. In the fall of 2020 the Agricultural Society advised of the intent to start charging a fee for winter storage of equipment same as it does for its regular clients. These fees are an important revenue source for the Agriculture Society to maintain its buildings.

The Walkerton Agricultural Society presented to staff in February 2021 a draft agreement to formalize this arrangement. The agreement has been reviewed by staff and the Clerk's Department and revised accordingly and shared with Walkerton Agricultural Society. See Reciprocal Agreement attached for Council's consideration.

Analysis:

This arrangement between the Municipality and the Walkerton Agricultural Society continues to mutually benefit each other and is operationally important to the Parks and Recreation Department for the secure storage of equipment throughout the year. The Parks and Recreation Department has limited storage facilities and no other options at this time to sufficiently store all of its equipment and attachments in its own buildings. Staff recommends that Council approve entering into this agreement.
